THE EXPERTS

Yadh LABBENE: Founding member and former President of the Tunisian Association of Climate Change and Sustainable Development (2C2D), accredited to the Secretariat of the UNFCCC and its subsidiary bodies, he follows climate change issues since the early 90s. Currently, he is an activist in the field of environment and consultant in the field of climate change with various experiences with international partners including GIZ, the African Development Bank, the European Union and the UNDP.

Omar AL SHOSHAN: Co-Founder and chairman of the Jordan Environmental Union, the Jordan first coalition of environment and nature protection agencies. He has several experiences as environmental expert, such as consultant for the UNDP and head of environmental policies and advocacy specialist for the jordan Royal Society for the Conservation of Nature. Among his awards, the Sustainable Sanitation Alliance's (SuSanA) prize, held as part of the Stockholm World Water Week 2017 for setting a strong example in using alternative water resources for irrigation and reusing water for sustainable sanitation.

Kevin BURDEN: A media consultant who works with media houses and organisations worldwide. During a BBC career spanning 20 years, he served as a reporter, correspondent, presenter, producer, editor and manager. For several years, he specialised in reporting on environmental issues, including energy, food and farming, water and waste, and climate change. Since leaving the BBC in 2008, Kevin has worked with many international, national and local organisations working in the field of science, health and the environment, helping them to communicate more effectively with the public.
